All *eight* million people live in the city's five boroughs: *Manhattan, Queens, Brooklyn*, the *Bronx* and Staten Island. The density is over *10 000* people per 1 sq km. The smallest but the most famous borough, *Manhattan*, is an island, which is famous for its high *skyscrapers/rised buildings*, business and shopping districts, theatres, museum and parks. The most famous sights are:

- the *Statue of Liberty* which has been standing on *Liberty* Island since 1884 and is 93 m high and is a symbol of hope and freedom.
- the *Empire State Building* is the tallest skyscraper in New York, (and up until 1970 it used to be the highest building in the world), it's nearly 400 m high.
- *Central Park*, the largest and most popular park in the middle of *Manhattan*, where famous concerts are held.
- *Fifth* Avenue is one of the premier shopping streets in the world. It serves as a symbol of wealthy New York and is ranked as one of the most expensive streets in the world.
- *Broadway*, as the name implies, is a wide avenue, which runs the full length of Manhattan and continues into the Bronx. It is the oldest north-south main street in the city, dating to the first settlement and now is the home of American *theatre* industry.
- Wall Street is a street which runs east from Broadway through the historical centre of the *Financial* District. It is the first permanent home of the New York *Exchange* Office.
- *Times* Square has long been celebrated as New York's glittery crossroads (with massive TV screens). Up to a million people gather here every *New Year Eve* to see a brightly lit ball descend from the roof at midnight.
- The symbol of American immigration and a gateway for millions of people is *Ellis Island* as it served as an immigrant inspection station. Now it hosts a museum of immigration.
- St Patrickés Cathedral is a neo-gothic style Catholic church built in Manhatan just across the street from Rockefeller Center in 19th century.
