- a warm loose pair of trousers/pants and matching jacket worn for sports practice or as informal clothes
- tracksuit (jogging suit)/AE sweatsuit (sweatshirt, sweatpants)

- to risk money on a race or an event by trying to predict the result
- bet on/against st, bet st on st
- to finish a game without either team winning
- draw, draw with/against sb (end in a draw)
- to defeat somebody in a game or competition
- beat, beat sb at st (defeat)

Guess the sport

- This game is played on grass. You knock a wooden ball with a wooden hammer which has a long handle and a wooden head (it's called a *mallet*) through a series of hoops (curved wires).
- **croquet** [krəʊkeɪ]
- It's a team game, you need a bat and a ball. Each player tries to hit the ball and then run around four bases before the other team returns the ball.
- **baseball**

- A game played on a field by two teams of ten players who use sticks with curved nets on them to catch, carry, and throw the ball.
- **lacrosse** [ləˈkrɒs]
- The sport of riding on waves while standing on a narrow board.
- **surfing**
- A game in which two teams of players riding on horses try to hit a ball into a goal using long wooden hammers (called mallets).
- **polo** [pəʊləʊ]
- A game played by two teams of 13 or 15 players, using an oval ball which may be kicked or carried. Teams try to put the ball over the other team's line.
- **rugby** (named after Rugby school, where the game was first played)
